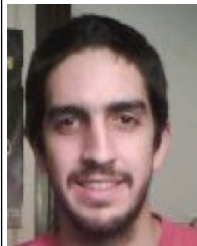

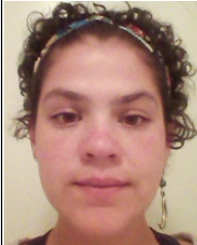
■ GENERAL DICTUM
